Ordinance No. 81

TO PUNISH MINOR MISREPRESENTING THEIR AGES TO PROCURE IN-

The Village of Calumet , in Houghton County, Michigan, ordains:

Section 1. Any minor who shall represent that he is of the age of twenty-one years or older for the purpose of adding for, or receiving any intoxicating liquors from any keeper of any place of any name whatsoever for the sale of intoxicating liquors, except in cases authorized by law, shall be deemed guilty of misdemeaner.

Section 2. "Intoxicating Liquors" as used herein means any spirituous, vincous, malt, or fermented liquor, liquids and compounds, whether or not nedicated, proprietary, patented, and by whatever name called, containing one half of one per cent or more of alcohol by volume which are fit for use for beverage purposes.

Section 3. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall on conviction thereof be punished by a fine not exceeding One Hundred (\$100) Dellars or in risonment in the County jail for a term not exceeding ninety days or both in the discretion of the Court.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force twenty days after this passage. Passed by the Common Council of the Village of Calumet. Houghton County, Michigan, on January 6, 1948.
