

Ordinance # 83

An ordinance relative to control and disposition of animals found running at large within the Village of Calumet.

Whereas it has come to the attention of this Council that large numbers of dogs, cats and other animals are running at large in and upon the streets, alleys and other public places within the Village of Calumet, and


Whereas, such stray animals are annoying to the peace of the inhabitants of the Village and are dangerous to the safety and health of the public,


Now, Therefore, the Village of Calumet ordains:

" That all dogs, cats or other animals found running at large upon the streets, alleys or other public places within the Village of Calumet are hereby declared a nuisance and the Village Marshall or other police officer shall pick up any such animal and confine the same in a safe place for a period of not to exceed three (3) days; during such period the owner or keeper of such animal may claim such animal and any such animal so claimed shall be turned over and delivered to such owner or keeper upon the payment to the Village Marshall or other police officer of the sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar for each day such animal may be held; in the event any such animal picked up and detained as above set forth shall not be claimed within the period of three (3) days as aforesaid or in the event any such animal is claimed by the owner or keeper thereof who fails or refuses to pay the said sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar per day while said animal is confined by the Village Marshall or other police officer as aforesaid, then the Village Marshall or other police officer of the Village of Calumet is hereby directed to destroy any such animal.

"The term "running at large" used herein shall mean any animal who is found unattended in or by its owner or keeper upon the streets, alleys or other public places within the Village of Calumet. "
