The Village of Caluset ordains:

That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to maintain or suffer to be maintained any nuisance.

A nulsance shall be held to embrace any public nulsance as known at common law or in equity, jurisprudence and whatever is dangerous to human life or safety or detrimental to health and shall include any building, structure or any pertion thereof in eald Village, that has suffered danger by recease of decay, fire or otherwise making such structure dangerous to human life or safety.

Upon being informed of the existence of any nuisance, the Fresident of the Village shall appoint a committee of three members of the Council to investigate the said reported missage, which said committee shall make its report to the President within ten days; if said committue reports the existence of a nuisance, the President and Board of Brustees may adopt a resolution finding such report to be a fact and that a nuisance exists, and setting a time and place at which the owner may appear before the Village Council to be heard upon the matter, and the Village Clerk shall thereupon notify the owner by letter addressed to the owner's last known address. Upon such hearing, or if the owner fails to uppear, the Council may adopt a resolution condemning said building or structure as a nuisance and ordering the owner to remove the same within each time as the Council may in said resolution deco reasonable. If the owner or opoupant of said lot or premises fails or refuses to remove said nuisance when ordered by the Council so to do, the Village may insur any expense in causing the same to be done, such expense may be charged upon such lot or promises, and sollected as a special assessment thereon, or such expense may be recovered by. the Village in an action of assument against the emer or occupant of any such lot or presises. If the owner cannot be found, the Village Clerk shall send ceptes of such notices or resolutions to his last known address and shall post copies thereof upon said premiuse. If said premises be occupied, the Village Clerk shall also deliver copies of such notices or resolutions to the occupant.

This ordinance shall become effective twenty days after its passage. Adopted and approved by the Village Council of the Village of Calumet this 6th day of May A.D.1952
