

THE VILLAGE OF CALUMET ORDAINS:

Definitions: The term "alcoholic liquor", as used in this ordinance shall be construed to include any spirituos, vinous, malt or fermented liquor, liquids and compounds containing 1/2 of 1% or more of alcohol by volume which are fit for beverage purposes.

1. No person under the age of twenty-one (21) years shall purchase or knowingly possess or transport any alcoholic liquor, or knowingly possess, transport, or have under his control in any motor vehicle any alcoholic liquor unless such person is employed by a licensee licensed by the Michigan Liquor Control Commission and is possessing, transporting or having such alcoholic liquor in a motor vehicle under his control during regular working hours and in the course of his employment.

2. No alcoholic liquor shall be consumed on the streets, alleys or other public places within the Village.

3. No alcoholic liquor shall be sold to any person unless he shall have attained the age of twenty-one (21) years.

4. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not more than ONE hundred (\$100.00) dollars or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than six (6) months or both, in the discretion of the Court.

This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after its passage.
