Ordinance for the Repeal of Ordinances

An Ordinance for the repeal of ordinances
now antiquated or obsolete or which no longer
serve a useful public purpose.

THE VILLAGE OF CALUMET HOUGHTON COUNTY, MICHIGAN ORDAINS:

WHEREAS, certain ordinances of the Village of Calumet are now antiquated, obsolete, no longer serve a useful public purpose or contain language which is anachronistic or otherwise inappropriate in the present age,

The village clerk shall certify to the adoption of this ordinance and cause the same to be published as required by law.


